

NATIVE PRAIRIE 7

WITH OATS

*Big Bluestem, Indiangrass, Little Bluestem, Sideoats Grama, Switchgrass
Virginia Wildrye, Western Wheatgrass, Oats*

Miller's Prairie 7 with oats is a mixture of both warm and cool-season native grasses. Oats are added to provide quick soil stabilization and acts as a nurse crop while the native grasses germinate. This combination provides season-long interest, excellent erosion control, and wildlife habitat. Establishment takes 2-3 years and will have a height of 3-7 feet.
